## **Criminal Justice-Social Services**

(3CRIJ-SS, 4CRIJ-SS)





Are you looking for an exciting, rewarding and meaningful profession? Do you want to be a role model in your community? Consider a career in public service in one of the fastest growing employment areas. Careers in this field include law enforcement professionals, emergency management and homeland security, and various positions in social work, corrections, probation, and parole. The criminal justice field is a wide and ever-expanding career field that offers employment for the future. A degree in criminal justice is best for those individuals who want to pursue a challenging



career in a criminal justice profession, which has been referred to as the "new" liberal arts degree of the future. Students wishing to pursue a four-year degree at a university should enroll in the associate of arts (A.A.) degree plan for the maximum of transferable credits in their chosen field. The criminal justice A.A. degree is the perfect complement to many four-year degrees for its flexibility across disciplines as well as pre-law. The associate of applied science (A.A.S.) degree offers the educational foundation needed in policing, social work, corrections, probation and parole. In addition, there are five certificates of technology that focus on educational direction and are centered around professional fields.

San Jacinto College criminal justice has the educational pathway that will help you advance in your field.

San Jacinto College is a founding member of the POTAAC Agreement with Texas community colleges. This agreement ensures that an option is available for licensed Texas peace officers to obtain college credit for having attended a basic peace officer's academy in Texas after 1983. Upon proof of completion of a basic academy by having successfully passed the state's licensing exam, San Jacinto College will articulate 18.0 WECM semester hours upon completion of six hours of criminal justice in residency at San Jacinto College.

San Jacinto College exempts licensed Texas peace officers, who are employed as full time officers, from tuition on criminal justice courses that apply to degrees or certificates in that discipline.

## **Job Opportunities**

Crime is a social problem that will always provide employment opportunities for competent police officers and other criminal justice professionals, such as probation and parole officers. In addition, there will always be equal opportunities for social service providers such as CPS (Child Protective Services), APS (Adult Protective Services), and mental health officers (MHMR). The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that by the year 2016, there will be almost 100,000 police officers employed around the country.

The employment demand in this area is fueled by large dense populations that continue to increase in the Houston-Galveston area.

Degrees and certificates in criminal justice lead to employment in criminal justice occupations such as police and correctional officers. While the threshold for licensure as a police officer in Texas is a high school degree, most local departments look for applicants with a two- or four-year degree.

Only about 20 percent of law enforcement personnel work at the federal levels, so expect competition when applying for positions at the state and federal level.

The associate of arts (A.A.) in criminal justice sets the foundation for the completion of higher education, either a bachelor of arts or master of arts, depending on what professional field you choose.

The associate of applied science (A.A.S.) in criminal justice sets the foundation for the completion of higher education, or can be a terminal degree.

Those desiring to work in social work (CPS, ADS, and fields that include juveniles), or at the Federal level, will need to complete a four year degree or higher.

Certificates in special fields increase knowledge of specific areas and are often used to meet college requirements for hiring requirements of specific agencies where employment is desired.
